From the Rabbi

Matzah, Marror, and Romance?

Though the flowers are blooming and birds singing, when one thinks about the spring festival of Passover, romance is unlikely to come to mind. But if we take our head out of the haggadah, manage to see past the brimming bowls of matzah ball soup, and can ignore the distracting aroma of a well-cooked brisket, we find hidden in Chag Hamatzot, the festival of dry, tasteless crackers a very steamy, flavorful, and passionate story.

The story is found in Song of Songs, the book of the Hebrew Bible traditionally read during Passover.

One of the five megillot, Song of Songs is a romantic, and at times erotic, **poem. According to it's** opening lines, the book was written by King Solomon, **one of Judaism's** most prolific paramours. Though this claim of authorship is suspect, the book vividly and beautifully describes the passion felt between lovers. Some of **Judaism's best known** statements about love, **including "I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine (2:16)" and "Set me as a seal upon your heart (8:6)," are taken from its** pages.

Many find a profound mes-

sage in the dedication of **one of the Hebrew Bible's** 24 books to the subject of love. Others, however, are uncomfortable with the inclusion of a book so focused on earthly matters. Perhaps responding to this discomfort, there developed, beginning in the early rabbinic period, a tradition of reading Song of Songs as an allegory for the love between God and the people of Israel. It is this understanding that leads to **Song of Songs' connection to the** holiday of Passover. As the **sages explain, God's freeing** of the Israelites from slavery is among the foremost **expressions of God's love.**

Whether understood as a poem about human love or that between the people Israel and God, Song of Songs adds the vocabulary of passion and romance to the festival of Passover.

As a congregation we **acknowledge this "romantic"** side of Passover by inviting those couples marking a significant anniversary (those ending in 5 or 0) to join us on Shabbat Passover, April 18, for a special blessing of their marriage. We hope that you will share in this special occasion. It is truly inspiring to celebrate these long lasting and loving relationships.

Also, beginning this month our Torah study group will turn its focus to the reading

of Song of Songs. We will explore the plain meaning of the text and that offered through an allegorical understanding. Our study will include insights offered by traditional commentary as well as historic, literary, and feminist scholarship. Our study begins on Saturday, April 5, continuing on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of the month. Learners of all ages and experience are welcome to join us. Whether by joining us for Torah study, participating in our special Shabbat Passover anniversary blessing, or including passages of Song of Songs in your seder, I hope you will find a way to incorporate Song of Songs into your Passover celebration. After all, life is richer when filled with romance.

From the President

At our February 20th meeting, the Board of Directors approved a renovation project for our temple campus. Our campaign goal is \$1.6M.

The Greenhut family's company will do the work at cost. Bill Greenhut has offered to oversee the entire project with Andrew Rothfeder. The Board also authorized a Renovation Committee which had already been functioning and a capital campaign fund to finance the renovation. To date we have commitments of \$1.358M. Please understand that the project is moving forward. We need to obtain commitments from every member of the congregation in order to bridge the difference between what we hold in commitments and what we need to complete the renovation. Let me put it another way. Every dollar short of our goal is a dollar **we can't use in the renovation** of our temple campus. I want to assure every member, that we will be contacting you for a commitment to the renovation. Please be as generous as possible. This project may well determine the future of Reform Judaism here in the greater Pensacola area. We need your help now!

The committee and the Board are committed to keeping the membership fully informed and our actions transparent. If there are questions you have about the project please contact any member of the renovation committee, members of the Board of

Directors or me. The only dumb question is the one that is never asked.

At every Shabbat service there will be an announcement inviting the membership to attend the monthly Board of Directors meetings. They are held on the third Thursday of each month at 5:45 pm in the social hall. As a permanent part of the agenda, I have established a membership participation time. Congregants can come to the meeting and discuss their issues with the Board. As a follow-up to the membership access to the Board meetings, once minutes of the Board meetings are approved, members can obtain copies from the Temple Administrator, Kathy Smith.

After many months of hard work by the committee, the Board approved the Temple Beth El Long Range Plan and recommended it to the membership for their approval at the annual **membership meeting. This year's** meeting will be held on Sunday, May 18th. Advanced copies will be available during April. The committee included Ray Engle, Marny Needle, Alice Klein, Alan Sacks, Charles Kraselsky, Janet Kahn, Rabbi Flee-kop and Fred Levin. Knowing how much dedication to our Temple and the effort this project consumed in each of their lives, they have **the Congregation's admiration**, and deepest appreciation.

Break out the matzos, grind up the horseradish, open the bottles of gefilte fish and bottles Mogen David and Manischewitz Passover wines. Passover is coming at sundown on April 14th. Remember that it is holy time as well as a festival of freedom for family, friends and members of our Jewish community. At our Seders, it is as if you experienced the Exodus from Egypt. I can recall many years ago in the Antarctic Ocean south of the Antarctic Circle onboard a small destroyer escort. We had a Seder for four of us! Since we had experienced 4 months without daylight and were transitioning into the half of the year during which there was only light, deciding when sunset occurred was difficult. Our radio operators contacted Israeli Army radio and obtained sunset time in Jerusalem. We had our Seder and on time with the help of most crew. These are fond memories of events that seem just as far away as the Exodus itself. Jan and I send to you and yours best wishes for a good Pesach and an enjoyable Seder.

Educator's Message: The Blessing of Food



In the coming weeks we clean our house in preparation for Pesach. We scramble to try to consume as much pasta and cereal as we can in order to make room for our Matzah and other

Passover foods. As we sort through our pantry shelves, we are reminded of what we eat and what we have purchased and not consumed.

Consider this an opportunity to think about your food habits. Are you eating healthy foods? Are you buying healthy products and storing them in the back of the pantry, never to be used? What about portion sizes? Are you eating more than you need? Are you eating enough?

Dr. Wendy Mogul, author of the Jewish parenting books, Blessing of a Skinned Knee and Blessing of a B Minus, suggests that we approach food considering the following three principles: moderation, sanctification, and celebration.

Moderation. We are all too aware

that Americans eat too much and that portion sizes have increased tremendously in recent years. How can a family tackle this issue? Dr. Mogul suggests that by sitting with others and slowing down, we can take the opportunity to **“think about how many people are at the table, how much food there is, and how much of it we’ll need to be satisfied.”**

Sanctification. Dr. Mogul recommends, **“One way to encourage your family to eat moderately and with maximum pleasure is to sanctify mealttime.”** Judaism provides us with set blessings we can say before a meal. A short blessing can serve not only as a thank-you to God, but also a reminder that eating is itself a holy act.

Celebration. For many, food has become something to feel guilty about. Gosh, did I really need to eat that second piece of cake? Food has also become something many people fear. We frantically look at the fat content and calories and weigh the pros and cons of consumption. If I eat this, how far will I have to walk to burn it off? While healthy eating is important, so is enjoy-

ing it. According to Mogul, **“In Judaism, the purpose of eating is partly to fuel ourselves to serve God and partly to force us to enjoy what God has provided.”** She adds that saying the blessing before eating a candy bar reminds us to celebrate its taste, but if we eat too many, they are no longer special and worth celebrating.

As we perform our spring Pesach **cleaning, let’s take time to think about** our food habits. Do we eat in moderation? Do we sanctify our food by offering thanks to God? Would this enhance our relationship with food and with God? Do we have a positive or negative relationship with food? Do we constantly feel guilty about what we eat or do we enjoy and savor our meals?

May your Passover be filled with family and joy. May your table serve as a sanctuary of moderation, sanctification and celebration.

Confirmation Trip to Washington DC

Though events and illness conspired to shrink the once mighty delegation of four to one (plus chaperone) the voice of this year's **Confirmation Class** was heard loud and clear in Washington's halls of power.

From March 7 - 10, Eviana Linder and Rabbi Joel Fleekop joined more than 250 Reform Jews from around the country as participants in the Religious Action Center's L'taken weekend.

The word L'taken means "repair" and that was the job of those teenagers in attendance: to learn about issues confronting our country, what Jewish tradition has to say about those issues, and then lend their voice to finding a solution. The highlight of the trip was **Monday, when participants spent the day on "The Hill."** Our delegation visited the offices of Senator Rubio, Senator Nelson, and Representative Miller, with Eviana speaking in support of the Employment Non-Discrimination Act (s.815, hr.1755).

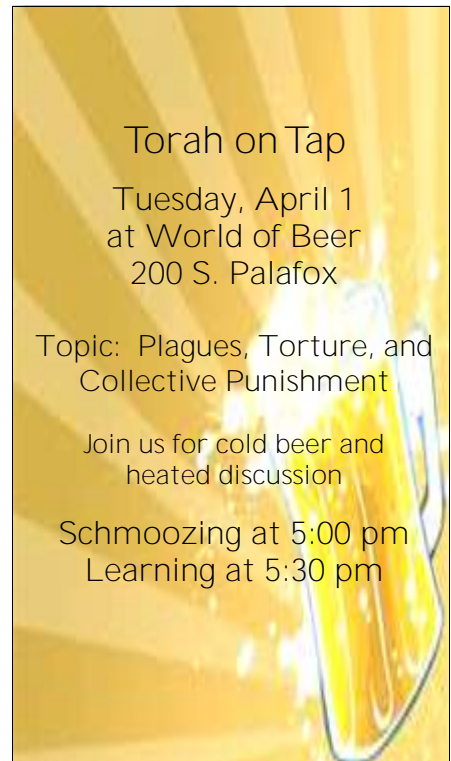
