Dear Community,

What a CRAZY and AMAZING month March was! We had lots of events, lectures, meetings and programs going on, and I couldn't be happier that we did:)

Our main event was probably Purim, truly one of my favorite

holidays! Eating Hamentaschen, wearing costumes and having a good, festive timewhat more can you ask for?

So in the mood of all the Purim celebrations we had, a couple of interesting facts about this awesome holiday in Israel:

- 1) Hamentaschen are called "Ozney Haman"- ואוזני המן Hebrew. The triangular shape symbolizes Haman's ears after he was hanged, therefore- the given name.
- 2) Adloyada (עדלאידע)meaning- "Until one no longer knows", is a famous parade held in Israel during Purim.

It is a tradition dating back to the early days of Tel Aviv, in 1912, even though in the late 60's it was transferred to Holon, where it has been taking place ever since. It is a great event and children from all around the country gather to see the different costumes, rides and floats.

3) The streets of Israel become crowded with people, all ages, dressed up, singing, dancing and drinking while celebrating this festive holiday. Street parties take place in main cities like Jerusalem and Tel Aviv and the whole state dresses up. It is seriously a unique experience!

But that's not all; let's not forget that this month we had "Family Day" as well. This unofficial holiday was primarily set as "Mothers' Day" on the same date that Henrietta Szold died (13 February 1945). Szold, a U.S Jewish Zionist leader and founder of Hadassah, was one of the leading women in the welfare, health and education systems of the pre-state Jewish settlements in Israel. She had no biological children, but her organization- Youth Aliyah, rescued many Jewish children from Nazi Germany. She is considered the "mother" of all those children, therefore a suggestion of setting her annual remembrance day as Mother's Day, was accepted. During the 90's, "Mother's Day" was changed into "Family Day" in order to celebrate the mutual love and responsibility inside the family.

May we all remember to cherish our beloved ones and celebrate our families, as unique as they are.

Temple Beth El does not have a "burial fee". Instead, the bylaws adopt a system based on a Perpetual Care Fee. As a reminder and to assist in your family financial planning, below is a listing of the current Perpetual Care fees:

Regular Members if purchased prior to death = \$3000

\$3000 Regular Members if purchased after death: Perpetual Care Fee plus 50% = \$4500 Non-Members but eligible for Regular Membership: Perpetual Care Fee plus 150% = \$7500 Each subscription to the Perpetual Care Fund shall cover one gravesite. This does not affect previously purchased Perpetual Care, including those covering lots, rather than individual gravesites. The Perpetual Care Fee may be paid "in full" or in installments over a period of time not exceeding five years provided the initial installment is not less than 20% of the total Perpetual Care Fee.
