 1 (15-oz) can chickpeas, drained and rinsed
 2 tablespoons mayonnaise
 1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil
 1 teaspoon curry powder
 1 garlic clove, finely minced
 1 teaspoon kosher salt</p> | <p>1 teaspoon pepper
 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
 2 ribs celery, chopped
 3/4 cup red grapes, halved lengthwise
 1/4 cup sliced almonds
 1 Multi grain Five-Grain bread loaf</p> | <p>1 (4-oz) container alfalfa sprouts
 2 red radishes, thinly sliced for garnish
 Steps
 1. Place chickpeas, mayonnaise, olive oil, curry powder, garlic, salt, pepper, and mustard in food processor bowl. Pulse 5-6 times</p> | <p>until ingredients are blended and chickpeas break down slightly. Place mixture in large bowl.
 2. Stir in celery, grapes, and almonds. Cover and chill at least 30 minutes (or overnight).
 3. Spread filling onto bread to make sandwiches</p> |

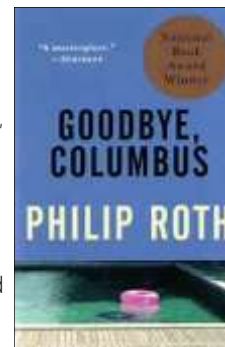

Jewish Book Club to Review Classic

The Jewish Book Club will meet August 30 at 7 PM
Book: Goodbye Columbus by Phillip Roth.
Presenter: Scott Sewell

We have had a very engaged crowd at our last 2 meetings. Please attend and let us keep this energy going. Phillip Roth's award-winning first book instantly established its author's reputation as a writer of explosive wit, merciless insight, and a fierce compassion for even the most self-deluding of his characters.

Goodbye Columbus is the story of Neil Klugman and pretty, spirited Brenda Patimkin, he of poor Newark, she of suburban Short Hills, who meet one summer break and dive into an affair that is as much about social class and suspicion as it is about love. The novella is accompanied by five short stories that range in tone from the iconoclastic to the astonishingly tender and that illuminate the subterranean conflicts between parents and children and friends and neighbors in the American Jewish diaspora.



ECARE: The beginning of a child's journey to success - You can help!

Every Child A Reader in Escambia (ECARE) is seeking Reading Pal volunteers interested in working with four year old pre-kindergarten students at the following locations: Global Learning Academy, Gibson Head Start Center, McMillan Pre-K Center, Montclair Elementary School and Weis Elementary School.

The goal of this program is to help students build strong early literacy skills necessary for kindergarten success. Volunteers are trained to effectively use themed literacy kits that engage children in age appropriate learning activities. Mentor training and on-going support are provided to ensure a positive volunteer experience. A successful background check including a Level II security screening is required of all volunteers. Volunteers are asked to be smoke, tobacco, and nicotine free while volunteering as a Reading Pal. A commitment of one hour per week for the school year is requested. Due to the classroom schedules, volunteers are generally asked to work between 9:00-11:30am or 1:00-3:00pm. **We allow some flexibility to accommodate our volunteers' personal and professional schedules;** volunteers may change volunteer time or day when necessary and may work in teams of two if desired. ECARE is a business led and volunteer driven collaborative that mobilizes community stakeholders to drive overall birth to five early learning results. It is our goal to build a strong foundation of students entering the education system ready to learn.

These devices help make the voices of any speaker using a microphone **in the sanctuary louder and clearer.
