Expansion of Safety and Security Guidelines

TV, newspapers and internet are full of violence against many organizations, particularly religious ones. It is crucial that Temple Beth EI prepare for emergencies. It is better to be proactive than reactive. Therefore we are expanding the Safety and Security Plan for Temple Beth EI to aid the congregation in reducing risks to staff and congregants. Our goal is to make Temple Beth EI as safe as possible for the facility and everyone who visits it.

Special thanks to Jaime Montero for his efforts and contributions during the past two years. As new co-chairs of the committee, we are looking forward to continuing this important work.

Temple Beth El is a member of the URJ (Union for Reform Judaism) which has many member congregations with security programs in place. We will learn a lot from URJ and their members.

Our initial approach will be to define what procedures are in place at Temple Beth El and add to that base other policies and procedures that will be of value. Once the updated policies and procedures are approved by the Temple Board, the team will ensure that training and information is provided appropriately. Then we will be able to handle emergencies when they occur and maintain the safety of our temple community and its facilities.

To accomplish this, we need volunteers to join the Safety and Security Team. We have spoken to current committee members and want to expand the group to include more men and women willing to join the team. Please contact one or both of us to contribute to this effort.
