Internally, much work has been focused on the sanctuary, the Max L.Bear Auditorium and the kitchen. Most of the beautiful mahogany pews have been removed for refurbishing and a few were moved to the balcony. The ones returning to the main floor will be converted to upholstered bench pews.
