Kitchen Kibbitz Quicky....by Janet Schilling

It's blueberry season and since Logan and I have an affinity for those delicious berries, I had a need to find space in the freezer. One bag remained from last year's foray into the blueberry patch in Molino, so I found a great recipe for a jam that is well worth the time to make. If you are not an experienced canner, no worries. This one is so good you will eat it up before it can spoil. Just follow the directions and store in the refrigerator. There are only a couple more weeks before the berries are gone. Go grab a bucket or two for a taste to enjoy through the end of the year.

Blueberry Plum Basil Jam (Small Batch) from canningacrossamerica.com

- ~Combine in a large pot: 2 pints blueberries, 5 or 6 small sweet plums, halved and pitted, and 1 cup sugar. Let sit 1 hour to macerate.
- ~Place pot over medium heat to dissolve any remaining sugar and add 1/2 Tbsp lemon juice.
- ~Raise heat to med-high, bring to a boil and boil for 10 minutes. Add a couple of whole sprigs of basil. Cover and remove from heat and infuse in jam five minutes.
- ~Remove basil and spoon into hot (sterilized jars). Seal with lids and process 10 minutes. Alternatively, place in refrigerator to store.
- ~Yields about 5 half-pints

Jews and The War of Northern Aggression July 6, 13, 27 @ 6:00pm

The Civil War is one of the most important events in American History. Join Rabbi Joel as together we explore the way the Civil War influenced the lives of Jews in the American South. As part of this mini-course we will learn about leading Jewish figures in the Confederacy, hear the stories of Jewish soldiers who fought for secession, and those who experienced the war on the home front.

Book Club to Discuss Award Winning Novel All are Invited to Participate

THE HILLTOP by Assaf Gauvron July 21 at 7 PM TBE

Chuck Kahn, Discussion Leader

This is a novel of contemporary life in a West Bank settlement. The author himself spent two years living in Tekoa Dalet, a remote hilltop settlement southeast of Jerusalem. That settlement became the model for the fictional Ma'aleh Hermesh C, where the novel takes place. The author focuses upon the forces that led the various occupants of Ma'aleh Hermesh C to choose settlement life, the relationships among the settlers, and the settlers' give and take with the outside world, including the Israeli government and nearby Palestinian neighbors. The book does not have a political angle. Instead, it shines some light upon a very real-often funny, sometimes poignant--slice of Israeli life. Here are excerpts from some recent reviews:

Mordantly funny and deeply moving, this award-winning novel about life in a West Bank settlement has been hailed as "brilliant" (The New York Times Book Review) and "The Great Israeli Novel [in which] Gavron stakes his claim to be Israel's Jonathan Franzen" (Tablet).
