Hamentaschen Overload!
As I am trying to finish this edition of the bulletin, I find myself left with a rare empty space. Rather than increase the font size on this page, I will share a recipe for a delicious and unique hamentaschen dough. Sydney McAbee introduced me to a cookbook by Joan Nathan entitled King Solomon's Table. It is filled with stories and recipes from the Jewish world. And it also includes some twists on the humble hamentaschen. Many of you may have sampled this one at Rabbi's Haman, Hamantashen, and Hefeweizen event just a few days ago. This one is savory and I am sure I will make it year round. Enjoy!

Pumpnickel Caraway Hamentaschen

Filling

- 1/2 c. sugar
- 1/2 c. Kalamata olives drained and pitted
- 2 Tbsp. olive brine
- 1/2 c. dried plums, pitted

Dough

- 1 1/2 Tbsp sugar
- 2 Tbsp butter
- 2 eggs, one whole and one separated
- 1 tsp. instant coffee
- 1 Tbsp molasses
- 1 Tbsp cocoa powder
- 3/4 c. flour
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1 Tbsp ground caraway seeds

Cream butter and sugar in food processor. Add whole egg and one yolk, coffee and molasses. Gradually add remaining dough ingredients and process until dough forms ball. Wrap in plastic wrap and refrigerate for at least 30 minutes. For filling: stir sugar and olive brine in small pan. Cook over medium heat until sugar caramelizes, about 5 min. Add the olives to the sugar and continue to cook for 2 minutes. Remove from heat and drain olives reserving the caramel. Transfer olives and plums to food processor and process leaving somewhat chunky. **Make hamentaschen by rolling dough 1/8" thick, cut with desired size circle cutter and place filling in middle. Seal 3 corners to make triangle. Add dollop of caramel to each. Bake on parchment at 350 for 20 minutes. Sprinkle with a bit of sea salt and can be garnished with thyme or caraway.**
