Temple Beth El Cemetery Perpetual Care Fees

Temple Beth El does not have a "burial fee". Instead, the bylaws adopt a system based on a Perpetual Care Fee. According to the bylaws, Article VIII Section 2e, the Perpetual Care Fund must produce sufficient earnings to cover all expenses associated with operating and maintaining the Temple Beth El cemetery. Based on the need to increase fees to cover the costs, the Board of Directors approved the following fees to become effective Jan. 1, 2015.

Regular Members if purchased prior to death: \$3000
Regular Members if purchased after death: Perpetual Care Fee plus 50% = \$4500
Non-Members but eligible for Regular Membership: Perpetual Care Fee plus 150% = \$7500

Each subscription to the Perpetual Care Fund shall cover one gravesite. This does not affect previously purchased Perpetual Care, including those covering lots, rather than individual gravesites. The **Perpetual Care Fee may be paid "in full" or in installments over a period of time not exceeding five years provided the initial installment is not less than 20% of the total Perpetual Care Fee.**

From the Rabbi

A Caring Community from Birth to Burial

As a Temple community we are there to share in the joy of our fellow congregants' celebrations and simchas and to support one another through life's difficulties and challenges. But according to Jewish tradition, our responsibility to one another extends beyond the bounds of life to include lovingly preparing those who died for burial.

For those who are traditionally observant, this includes the ritual washing of the body, dressing it in a burial shroud, and watching over it until the time of burial. Additionally, Psalms and other prayers are read.

The group who performs these sacred rituals is known as a Chevra Kadisha – or Holy Society. For years a devoted group of volunteers, most members of B'nai Israel Synagogue, have provided this service to those in Pensacola who desired a traditional Jewish burial. Many of these long-serving volunteers, however, are now aged and have difficulty performing the physical tasks required for washing and dressing the bodies.

Our community Chevra Kadisha is in need of a

new group of volunteers – and so I humbly ask you to consider embracing this important and meaningful mitzvah.

Whether or not your family's mourning practices or your personal plans for final arrangements include tahora – the ritual washing of the body and sh'mira – having someone present with the body until burial – I think you will find volunteering with the Chevra Kadisha a powerful and holy experience. As veteran volunteers have shared, by studying and performing rituals related to death, they have come to better understand the sacred value Judaism places on life.

Plus, as a Pensacola Jewish community I know that we want to ensure that those who lovingly provided these traditional rituals for others will have someone to perform them on their behalf.

Educator's Message: Community Learning

On Sunday, November 16, 2014 the Jewish community of Pensacola, along with a record breaking 500 communities around the world, will participate in the annual Global Day of Jewish Learning. The program will be held at Temple Beth El from 11am-12pm and is open to the community. There will be four parallel programs: one for adults and teens and three for our religious school students, including a PJ Library session.

For the third time, participation is sponsored by the Pensacola Jewish Federation.

This year's theme is Heroes and Villains, Saints and Fools: The People in the Book. Each of the sessions will focus on a particular biblical character and will utilize scripture, a variety of texts, discussion questions, and activities.

The Global Day of Jewish Learning was founded by Rabbi Adin Steinsaltz, the noted Jewish scholar and teacher, whose commentaries on the Talmud are contemporary classics and have sold more than 2 million volumes. As **he explained this year's theme, Rabbi Steinsaltz said, "The men and women of the Scriptures are more than mere life portraits: they continue to live and function long after their deaths in this world. These are not ordinary historical figures but archetypes; as such, their lives are carried on and continue not only in literature and philosophy but in the lives of their descendants throughout the generations." He went on to say, "In a sense, they continue to live and also to evolve throughout Jewish history, in its psychic experiences, and as a part of the collective personality of the Jewish nation."**

We hope you will join us for this opportunity of community learning and engagement!

Easy Cooking with Chocolate

Now that our company has departed, I have had time to look through the cookbook that Jordan and Candice sent to us. It is called **“The Great New Zealand Cookbook”** and it is filled with recipes from eighty chefs of New Zealand. Each has told a personal story about the recipes they are featuring and to make it more personal, each has written their story in their own handwriting! It is right up my alley, as I have always tried to share a story with you about the recipe I feature each month. One day I intend to gather all of my stories and recipes and bind them together for Jordan and Candice because there is nothing like a good recipe to make memories come alive.

Jo Seagar, one of the featured chefs shares a recipe for a basic oatmeal and chocolate cookie. No fuss - just chocolate and oats! Her cooking philosophy mirrors my own - easy and straightforward. I am also including a recipe that was passed along to me by our very own Rich Cacace. He assures me it is a super simple recipe and is always a crowd pleaser. I hope you will enjoy both!

Chocolate Chunk Oatmeal Cookies

1 c. butter, softened
3 Tbsp sweetened condensed milk
3/4 c. sugar
1 1/2 c. plain flour
1 1/2 c. rolled oats
1 tsp. baking powder
1 c. chopped dark chocolate or equivalent dark chocolate chips

Method:

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line two baking trays with parchment paper.
- Beat butter, condensed milk and sugar together until light and creamy.
- Add flour, rolled oats, baking powder and chocolate chunks.
- Flatten spoonfuls on the prepared trays and cook for 15-20 minutes until golden brown.
- Cool on a wire rack and store in an airtight container.

Chocolate Almond Biscotti

Ingredients
1/2 cup sweet butter, softened
1 1/4 cups sugar
2 eggs
1 tsp almond extract
2 1/4 cups flour
1/4 cup cocoa
1 tsp baking powder

1/4 tsp salt
1 cup sliced almonds
Chocolate glaze (optional):
1 cup chocolate chips
1 tbsp shortening

Method:

- **Preheat oven to 350 degrees**
- **In a mixing bowl, beat together** butter and sugar until smoothly blended.
- **Add eggs and almond extract, and** beat again until smooth.
- **In another bowl, sift together** flour, cocoa, baking powder and salt.
- **Gradually add to butter mixture** and blend until smooth.
- **Stir almonds into dough.**
- **Divide dough in half and shape** into 2 logs, about 11 inches long.
- **Place on greased cookie sheet (or** use parchment paper instead of greasing the cookie sheet), and bake for 30 minutes.
- **Remove from oven and cool for** about 10 minutes.
- **Use a serrated knife to make 1/2** inch slices.
- **Place slices back on sheet (flat on** their side) and bake for another 6 minutes then flip the slices over and bake for another 6 minutes.
- **Remove from oven and cool on a** wire rack.

To make the chocolate glaze (optional):
Mix the chocolate chips and shortening in a microwave-safe bowl. Heat it for 1 minute on high in the microwave. Stir until mixed and smooth.
Drizzle glaze over biscotti.

Dr. Nathan Rickoff was posthumously recognized as the Martin C. Glasser Kiwanian of the Year. This award is presented annually to the club member whose support of club activities both internally and externally helps to **promote the Kiwanis mission of “Serving the Children of the World”** in the local area. Dr. Rickoff was a member of Kiwanis for 64 years.

Professor Jonathan Adelman, Guest Speaker

Israel and Its Enemies: Iran, Syria, Hezbollah and Hamas

The Current Crisis In Israel

Professor Jonathan Adelman is a full professor at the Josef Korbel School of International Studies at the University of Denver. He has been made an Honorary Professor at both Peking University and People's University in Beijing. Having received four degrees from Columbia University, he has written or edited twelve books. In the last year he has written nine op-eds on the Middle East, China and Russia, five of which appeared on the CNN.com website (three on Fareed Zakaria's blog) and the other four on the websites of the Huffington Post, Forbes, UPI and Reuters. In the last two years he has been quoted in The New York Times, The Washington Post and NBC News. He also is working on two books, one of which will be entitled "Crushing the Revolution: The Role of the Military in Revolutionary In Israel".

Professor Adelman taught at both Hebrew University and the University of Haifa. In the late 1980s he worked for three years with the Israeli Foreign Ministry to organize groups of Chinese prince-lings to visit Israel as part of a successful plan to gain Chinese diplomatic recognition. He continues to work with the Israeli Foreign Ministry on ways to improve Sino-Israeli relations.

Professor Adelman founded and ran the Israel center in Denver for four years. He wrote a popular book on Israel, The Rise of Israel: A History of a Revolutionary State, for Routledge in London. He has gone on over 350 speaking tours on Israel in the US in the last decade. He has bought land in Kiryat Ata and Hadera. In August he was made an honorary member of AEPI fraternity for his work on Israel. He is a Fellow of the Center for Academic Engagement at the Israel on Campus Coalition.
