A Shabbat of History and Hope:

The evening begins at 6:00 pm with Shabbat worship in the sanctuary. The service, led by Rabbi Joel and songleader Nick May, will include special songs and readings on the themes of civil rights and equality.

Immediately following worship and a brief oneg, the congregation is encouraged to join Rabbi Joel at the Gulf **Power building for the world premiere of the documentary, "Who Killed Emmitt Till." Part of the FooFoo** Fest, this powerful documentary tells the powerful and tragic story of a 1955 murder which became one of the pivotal moments of the American Civil Rights movement.

The documentary explores not only the murder and climate in which it took place, but also the efforts by Emmett Till's family to ensure that their son's death not be forgotten and that injustice not go unchallenged.

Following the screening, Rabbi Joel and other community leaders will participate in a panel discussion on the film, the state of race relations, and the continuing struggle for civil rights.

Educator's Message: The Study of Torah Leads to Action

In a listing of important Mitzvot (Jewish responsibilities) Jewish tradition teaches, "The study of Torah is equal to them all because it leads to them all." In other words, the act of immersing ourselves in sacred texts is so empowering, it will lead us to take action.

On Sunday, November 15, 2016 we will have the opportunity for all ages to engage in Jewish learning with 500 Jewish communities around the world. For the fourth year in a row, the Pensacola Jewish Federation is sponsoring the Global Day of Jewish Learning. The program will be held at Temple Beth El and is free and open to the community. Details will be announced.

This year's theme is "Love: Devotion, Desire and Deception." Using our sacred texts, we will discuss several different examples of relationships. As Global Day founder Rabbi Adin Even-Israel Steinsaltz explains, "The men and women of the Scriptures are more than mere life portraits: they continue to live and function long after their deaths in this world. These are not ordinary historical figures but archetypes; as such, their lives are carried on and continue not only in literature and philosophy but in the lives of their descendants throughout the generations." He went on to say, "In a sense, they continue to live and also to evolve throughout Jewish history, in its psychic experiences, and as a part of the collective personality of the Jewish nation."

Kitchen Kibbitz by Janet Schilling

My mother-in-law taught me how to make cinnamon rolls. She made them effortlessly and though I would like to think her recipe made by my hands is just as delicious, I know that they will never have the subtle soft texture of hers nor the wonderful first bite taste just warm from the oven. The cinnamon roll lesson came fairly early in our marriage. And I have had 38 years to perfect it. And though I have made my own changes over the years so as to put my personal mark on her recipe, they still just don't compare.

As most of you know, my mother-inlaw passed away last month. She was 92 years old when she died. When I tell people that, they all remark that she had such a long life. And that is true. By comparison my own parents only lived into their very early 70's. But Margie was always so full of life, that it is hard to imagine that she wasn't able to surmount this final little health battle. She always told us, "you can't keep these Irish down" and she would always rebound, but sadly not this time. Logan and I were lucky enough to be with her in her final days. And

we even shared a few laughs including the infamous quote about the Irish. One of her last food requests in addition to a hamburger with onions, was a Cinnabon cinnamon roll. Even she knew that would be second-rate compared to hers, but a lot quicker to come by. The recipe I am sharing this month is for you bread bakers out there. Interestingly it is written on the inside cover of a cookbook from her collection that she gave to me: Jewish Cookery by Leah Leonard. And this is a perfect resting place for her recipe; a country recipe from a country girl given to her Jewish daughter-in-law in a classic Jewish cookbook. I hope she is smiling when I start softening the yeast.

Margie's Delicious Cinnamon

Rolls Dough: 1/2 c. milk 1/2 c. sugar 1 1/2 tsp. salt 1/4 margarine or butter 1/2 c. warm water

2 eggs 4 1/2 c. flour

2 pkgs yeast

Dissolve yeast in 1/2 c. warm water with 1 tsp. of sugar.

Scald milk. Add sugar, salt. Margarine or butter to warm milk. Add water and eggs plus 1 c. flour. Then add yeast mixture. Continue adding flour until smooth and elastic. Beat well after each addition. Cover dough and let rise till doubled, about 1 hour.

To make the rolls:

Turn dough out on a floured surface. Roll out to an oblong about 1/2 " thick that measures approximately 12 x 24. Spread with 1/2 stick of melted butter. Cover well with cinnamon, brown sugar and white sugar. (sorry, no measurements here-make yourself happy!) Roll lengthwise and pinch shut along long edge. Cut about 1" thick slices. In the bottom of a 13 x 9 inch baking dish, melt 1 stick butter. Stir in 1/2 c. sugar and 1/2 c. brown sugar. Spread evenly in bottom of pan. Add sliced cinnamon rolls to pan, cut side up. Cover and let rise 45 minutes-1 hour until doubled. Bake at 350 degrees until golden, about 25 minutes. Remove from oven and turn out from pan so that topping is still warm.
