Message from the President.....

As we start our new Jewish New Year of 5778 and we wind down 2017, I would like to take this opportunity to review Temple Beth El's financial status.

First of all, thanks to the recent and wonderful addition of new members, we are operating in the black, but not by a large margin. For those who were able to attend the annual meeting, we reviewed that the average cost to run the Temple is now at \$245 per person. We recognize that many members pay much more than that and some members are unable to pay that amount. If members who are currently paying less than the required average monthly cost, after careful consideration determine they can do more, now, as we begin our New Year, would be a wonderful time for a voluntary dues increase.

The finance committee has historically discussed requiring automatic annual dues increases just to keep up with increasing expenses. Although proposed and discussed, the board has never approved an automatic dues increase. As with most religious institutions, dues rates are not mandatory, but obviously necessary.

I am sure everyone like myself is enjoying our new facility. It has breathed life back into our congregation and we are now enjoying many religious and social events at this facility. However, our expenses have risen significantly. Examples are that we now have a \$180.00 a month elevator maintenance contract, our insurance rates have gone up, as well as utilities. We are also incurring more cleaning and maintenance expenses. Your board and officers work diligently to avoid unnecessary expenditures, while at the same time maintain the high quality of rabbinical leadership, programs and facilities for which Temple Beth El is now known across the community.

With this being said, we would appreciate everyone's consideration in taking a look at your annual dues obligation and considering an increase whether or not your family is above or below the \$245 per member per month minimum. In order to lead by example, Cindy and I have increased our dues by \$500 a year. Every little bit helps.

I thank you for your time and concern and look forward to seeing you at services.

Better Ways to Make Charitable Donations

Did you know that certain IRA distributions can be donated to the Temple taxfree?

If you are age 70½ or older, you can make qualified charitable distributions (QCD) from an IRA, up to \$100,000 per year (\$200,000 for married couples who qualify), without having to pay federal income taxes on the distributions. These distributions are not tax deductible and must be made payable to a qualified charity, such as Temple Beth El, directly from your IRA custodian. You can use the qualified charitable distribution to meet all or part of your required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year. One important caveat of using a QCD to satisfy an RMD obligation is that an RMD is presumed to be satisfied in the order of your distributions out of the IRA for the year. If you are over 591/2 but under 70½, you can take a regular taxable distribution from your IRA and then make a tax-deductible charitable donation.

Did you know that you can avoid paying taxes on capital gains when you donate appreciated securities?

Regardless of your age, it can be beneficial to donate appreciated securities directly to a qualified charity. The fair value of the securities is a tax-deductible charitable donation. In this way, you avoid having to pay taxes on the capital gains.

Charities must deposit the payments before December 31st to be considered for the applicable year. Your financial and tax advisors can help you evaluate these strategies to determine whether it makes sense in your overall estate plan. Please consider taking advantage of these provisions to help sustain our Temple!
