ROOM FOR A SUMMER RECIPE!!!!

Watermelon and Arugula Salad
 From Ina Garten, *"How Easy is That?"*
 Serves 6

1/2 lb. baby arugula leaves
2 lbs. seedless watermelon, 3/4" dice
 (3 lbs. with the rind)
 1/3 c. olive oil
 1/4 c. freshly squeezed lemon juice
 1 tsp. kosher salt
 1/2 tsp. freshly ground black pepper
 1/2 lb. chunk Parmesan cheese

Place arugula and watermelon in a large bowl. In a small bowl, whisk together the olive oil, lemon juice, salt, and pepper. Pour enough dressing on the arugula to moisten. Toss well and place on 6 salad plates.

With a very sharp knife or a vegetable peeler, shave the Parmesan into large shards and sprinkle them on the arugula and watermelon. Sprinkle with salt and serve.
