Federation Sponsors Antiquities Speaker

The Pensacola Jewish Federation, in association with the University of West Florida, is proud to announce a series of lectures by Dr. Jodi Magness of the University of North Carolina this month. Dr. Magness last addressed the Pensacola community in 2015 where she first revealed her exciting finding of an elephant mosaic from an early fifth century BCE synagogue in Hugog, Israel.

On Sunday, February 17, Dr. Magness will speak at the Voices of Pensacola Multicultural Center, 117 E Government Street. There will be a reception starting at 6:00 PM followed by the lecture at 7:00 PM. Her topic will be What Makes Jerusalem Special? The lecture is open to the public and will be free of charge.

"Jerusalem is venerated by the three Abrahamic faiths as the place where God's presence dwells. This belief originated with the biblical tradition that David brought to Jerusalem the Ark of the Covenant, and his son Solomon built the first house (temple) for the God of Israel on the Temple Mount. In this presentation we consider the sacred history of Jerusalem focusing on the Temple Mount."

On Monday, February 18, Dr. Magness will speak at a luncheon at Temple Beth EI, 800 N Palafox Street, starting at 11:30 AM. She will continue speaking on her amazing work in Huqoq with a lecture on "More than Just Mosaics: The Ancient Synagogue at Huqoq in Israel's Galilee".

"Since 2011, Professor Jodi Magness has been directing excavations in the ancient village of Huqoq in Israel's Galilee. The excavations have brought to light the remains of a monumental Late Roman (fifth century) synagogue building paved with stunning and unique mosaics, including biblical scenes and the first non-biblical story ever discovered decorating an ancient synagogue. In this slide-illustrated lecture, Professor Magness describes these exciting finds, including the discoveries made in last summer's season."
