US Navy jet pilot Charles Plumb was shot down in Vietnam and spent 6 years in a communist prison. He survived and now shares lessons learned from that experience!

**One day a man came to him in a restaurant and said, "You're Plumb! You flew jets in Vietnam from the aircraft carrier Kitty Hawk. You were shot down!" "How in the world did you know that?" asked Plumb. "I packed your parachute," the man replied. Plumb gasped in surprise and gratitude. The man said, "I guess it worked!" Plumb assured him, "It sure did! If that chute hadn't worked, I wouldn't be here today."**

Plumb couldn't sleep that night, thinking about that man, wondering how many times he might have seen him and did not even acknowledge his presence. He considered the many hours the sailor had spent at a long table in the bowels of the ship, carefully weaving the shrouds and folding the silks of each chute, holding the fate of someone he didn't know in his hands each time.

**Now Plumb asks audiences, "Who packs your parachute?" When Plumb's plane was shot down - he needed many different parachutes: a physical one, a mental one, an emotional one, and a spiritual parachute. He used all of those supports to survive.**

We each have someone who provides what we need to make it through the day. Sometimes daily challenges cause us to miss what is really important. We fail to: say hello, please or thank you, congratulate someone on something wonderful that has happened to them, give a compliment, or just do something nice for no reason. **As we go through this week, this month, this year, let's recognize people who pack our parachutes.**
