President's Message

I would like to share with you the hard work of your Temple Board and leaders. Everyone is working together to ensure a safe and welcoming place to have services and to see one another. Your board meets monthly and goes over the operation of the Temple overseeing finances, security, bylaws, Brotherhood and Sisterhood.

The administrative committee (President, Vice President and Past President) met and discussed ways to get adult education, among other topics, into the Temple programming and Shabbat services. Two roundtable sessions were held with Rabbi Joel with about 30 congregants discussing ideas about services, activities and direction for the future. Danny Zimmern is working with the ritual committee and bylaws committee to make sure our traditions are constant and our bylaws obligations are met. The finance committee led by Carol Kahn Rosenblatt constantly reviews our expenses and income. In view of the volatility in the stock market, the committee will meet with Merrill Lynch to review our investments.

Security is a top priority. Our safety committee is working to ensure we are prepared for any eventuality. I am glad to report that we have had a DHS survey to help us further improve our security footprint.

Rabbi Joel has been active in the community. He is on several boards and is active in the chaplain program. He continues to have services at Azalea Trace and teach an introduction to Judaism course. He is always there for life cycle events and strives to lend support to all those who need it.

Andrea has handled the School for Jewish Living and has been nationally recognized for her work during Covid. She is certified in counseling children who are in need of support, not to mention all the students she teaches Hebrew and prepares for bar or bat mitzvahs.

Kathy has been with us for over 20 years. She is an invaluable part of the day to day operation of the Temple. She works to do so many tasks that keep us going.
